## Animals can't vote, but you can!

For the EU 2024 elections, our parties pledge to join forces in order to:

Decrease the number of animals kept in the livestock industry by 75%	Stop the illegal pet trade and protect the welfare of cats, dogs and other pets
End the keeping of farm animals in cages	Protect stray animals and keep them safe and health
Ban animal transports longer than 2 hours	Cease using animals for entertainment purposes, such as for bullfighting and horse or donkey carriages
Introduce systematic controls for animal transports	Put an end to animal testing
Alleviate the suffering of animals in slaughterhouses	and any other form of animal cruelty
Introduce camera surveillance in slaughterhouses	Stop overfishing, prohibit octopus farming and prevent marine pollution
Put an end to un-stunned slaughter practices	Create marine sanctuaries and strictly protect 30% of the oceans
Close all fur farms and prohibit the import of fur	
Cease all hunting, including hunting for sport	Redirect EU subsidies away from industrial animal agriculture toward sustainable plant-based farming
Protect animals living in the wild, such as wolves	Appoint a dedicated EU-Commissioner for Animal Welfare
