- Restoring biodiversity. Ensure that dikes, roadside verges and rows of trees are all built and planted naturally, with room for plants and animals.
- Abolish recreational fishing. Fish must be able to lead a natural life rather than being a plaything for anglers.
- There is no time to lose. We must take action to reverse the effects of climate change and subsidence.

- Less animal suffering. A stop must be put to how muskrat and nutria populations are currently controlled.
- Protecting beavers. Prevent the endangered beaver from being killed!
- Cleaner wastewater discharge during peak times. Disconnect rain pipes and store enough water.
- Be careful when mowing and dredging.
